Greetings from the President

The 2011 7-Lag Stevne will be held at the Best Western Doublewood Inn and Conference Center in Fargo, North Dakota on July 14-17. The Stevne is an annual gathering of descendants of immigrants from seven areas [bygd] of Norway located in Buskerud, Oppland, and Telemark counties. Each of these areas is represented by an organization known as a "bygdelag" or "lag", for short. The six *lag* that will again participate in this year's stevne with Telelaget include those from Land, Hadeland, Numedal, Ringerike-Drammen, Sigdal, and Toten. In addition to genealogical assistance, there will be entertainment including folk music and dance, classes, and opportunities to purchase Nor-

This Stevne will be hosted by Sigdalslag. The Stevne theme, "Strength in Unity," is a translation of the motto which is inscribed on the banner presented to Sigdalslag in 1915 by the people of Sigdal Kommune. The logo, featuring a knot and the flags of Norway, the United States and Canada, symbolizes the connection that ties us all together from the farthest reaches of Norway to the faraway lands of America and Canada. design at the bottom of this page.] This connection is especially significant for Sigdalslag this year because they are celebrating 100 years since their founding in Fergus Falls,

MN, in 1911. More that 125 visitors from Norway will join us at the *Stevne*.

Again this year, 7-Lag Stevne will have its own Web site, www.7lagstevne.com, with the most up-to-date information. The webmaster is Anne Sladky, who also is webmaster for our Web site, www.telelaget.com.

All attendees, including students, may register beginning on Thursday, July 15. Registration is \$20 per person if paid before June 20 and \$25 thereafter. Students will be admitted free. There will be a separate fee of \$23 for the banquet held on Saturday evening along with the popular bunad parade.

Stevne attendees will also have the option to participate in three tours: Tour #1 on Friday AM to the Hjemkomst Center in nearby Moorhead; Tour #2 on Friday PM to the Otter Tail County Historical Museum in Fergus Falls, MN; and Tour #3 on your own schedule to Bonanzaville in West Fargo, ND.

On Sunday, July 17 Telelaget will hold our annual meeting. After the meeting members are invited to visit Concordia Lutheran Church and the Buffalo River Valley Settlement near Glyndon, MN. It was the home of many Telemark immigrants, Rev. Bendik Bondahl, the first president of Telelaget, is buried in the church cemetery.

A more detailed description of the *stevne*, a schedule, tour descriptions, and a registration form are contained on pages 8 through 11 of this publication. Registration forms are also available online along with a complete guide to *Stevne* activities on the Web site.

Telelaget to Conduct 2012 Telemark/Norway Tour

Every five years since 1992, Telelaget has sponsored tours of Telemark as well as other sites in Norway. Plans are to again conduct a ten-day tour in late July to early August in 2012. The tour will begin in Stavanger, the oil capital of Norway. Stavanger hosts the recently built replica of the first immigrant ship to leave Norway, the Restauration. When we cruise in the harbor, we will get a taste of the conditions for those who sailed from Stavanger to America in 1825. There will also be another boat tour on the Lysefjorden, which passes the Prekestol (Pulpit), a flat-topped crag 1,960 ft. above sea level.

The tour will continue by bus north and east over the Hardangervidda to Telemark. A stop at the homes of two literary "giants", Asmund Vinje and Tarjei Vesaas, is planned in western Telemark.

The following days in Telemark will focus on visiting historical sites and time for farm visits. Skien's many attractions will not be forgotten, since we did not stop there in 2007.

A feature of the tour will be the opportunity to do mountain hiking. At the same time as the main group is touring historical sites, we offer younger members (or our children or grandchildren) who are physically fit, to experience climbing Telemark's Gaustatoppen, Norway's sixth highest mountain. Following is a five-day hike on the beautiful Hardangervidda, stopping at mountain cabins. Tone Jorunn Tveito, professional folk singer who also has degrees in outdoor life and biology, will be the experienced hiking guide and will make this an unforgettable experience. You may remember Tone as the spirited entertainer at the 2009 7-Lag Stevne in River Falls, WI

The tour will end in Oslo with opportunity for extended stays in Norway. Additional information about the tour will be provided in the September 2011 *TeleNews*.

Elaine Nordlie, who conducted the very successful 2002 and 2007 tours, will again serve as tour director. Having resided in Norway for 15 years, Elaine has in-depth knowledge of Norway, particularly the Telemark region, and speaks fluent Norwegian.

Telemark to America, Volume III Available Soon

Telelaget has published two *Telemark to America* books and the third book will soon be ready for print. *Telemark to America, Volume III* is being indexed and will go to print in June or July. As in *Volume I* [Emigration] and *Volume II* [Settlements], this volume has a section with histories about the early Telemark settlements collected by Torkel Oftelie, who was a Telelaget founder and *Telesoga* editor for many years. Torkel visited most of the Telemark settlements in the Minnesota, Wisconsin and Iowa between the years of 1907 to 1926. [See page 7 of this publication to order *Volume I* or *Volume II*.]

The settlements included in *Volume III* are the following:

Wisconsin - Pigeon Creek and Trempeleau Valley

Minnesota - Santiago and Glendorado Townships, Six Mile Grove, and Melvin and Fertile in Polk County North Dakota - Northwood, Hoople, McKenzie County, and Crosby

Oregon - Silverton

There are three sections included in *Volume III*. The first section includes settlement histories. Section two contains biographies about individuals and family histories, some with distressing stories. The third section includes articles related to Telemark lore. The sagas are informative, as well as entertaining, giving us a glimpse into the lives and culture of Telemark's people.

Elaine Nordlie, Alice Kirn and Darrel Johnson have been primarily responsible for the translation and preparation of this book. They hope to have it ready for sale by September 2011. Please check Telelaget's Web site for information on the availability of the book.

Visit to Buffalo River Settlement Planned

Our annual meeting will be held on Sunday, July 17, 2011 at the 7-Lag Stevne in Fargo. After the meeting, Telelaget members are invited to visit and attend a 10:00 AM church service at Concordia Lutheran Church located about 10 miles northeast of Fargo in what was originally known as the Buffalo River Settlement. The area was settled in 1870 and 1871 by Norwegian immigrants, primarily from Telemark. Most had originally settled in Houston County in southwest Minnesota and took advantage of the 1862 Homestead Act to claim farms in the rich farmland in the Buffalo River Valley. The Thortvedt, Skrei, Midgarden, and Gunderson families were among the early settlers.

At the time of the settlement the nearest other settlement was the Georgetown Trading Post north of what is now Moorhead. Major farm equipment and food items had to be purchased in Alexandria, about 100 miles and a two-week trip away. Concordia Lutheran Church, then known as Moland Church, was established in 1873.

Among the pastors who served the church was Bendik Gunnarson Bondahl. He was a founder and the first president of Telelaget beginning in 1907 until his death at the age of 39 on August 9, 1908. He was pastor of Concordia Lutheran Church from 1904 to 1908. We will visit his grave site in the Concordia Lutheran Church Cemetery.

In Memory of Past Members

Although we haven't made a practice of printing obituaries of current and past members of Telelaget; however, during the past year there have been a large number of active Telelaget leaders and members who have passed away this past year.

In June, 2010, **Robert Christensen** of Maple Valley, WA, died. Many of you will remember that Robert served as *Telesoga* editor for five years [1999 - 2003]. His wife, Joann, mentioned that he enjoyed participating in Telelaget and was especially interested in genealogy. Robert assisted many members with their family reseach related to their Telemark ancestry.

Charlotte Sersland, age 93, of Minneapolis passed away on August 5, 2010. She along with her late husband, Harold, and her daughter Carol were all very active in Telelaget. Harold and Carol both served on the Board of Directors during the 1980s. They also specialized in performing Telemark folk dances and music at various Telelaget events.

In November 6, 2010, **Sally Oftelie**, age 83, of Grand Rapids, Minnesota died after a long illness. She is survived by her husband, Stan, daughter Rebecca, and sons Jim and Richard. Stan is a grandson of Torkel Oftelie, a Telelaget founder and writer. Stan and Jim have been active Telelaget members and participated in the 2007 Telemark Tour. Sally provided historical information for our 100th Anniversary book.

On September 30, 2010 **Craig Haugo**, age 47, son of Sharon and John Haugo, died unexpectedly from a viral infection of his heart at his home in Gilbert, AZ. He was a Telelaget member and had consulted with our webmaster during the conversion to our new Web site in 2008.

After a long illness, **John Kirn**, age 80, passed away at his home in Helena, Montana on April 10, 2011. He is the husband of Telelaget Board Member and *Telesoga* Editor Alice Kirn. John, who spent most of his career as a community college educator, and Helen moved to Montana from Wappingers Falls, New York several years ago.

May 2011 Telesoga Features Tarjei Vesaas

Tarjei Vesaas (1897-1970), a Norwegian poet and novelist from Vinje, Telemark, is featured in the May 2011 issue of *Telesoga*. He is widely considered to be Norway's greatest writer of the twentieth century and its most important since World War II. His writings reflect the destruction he witnessed after World War I. Written in Nynorsk, his books were characterized by simple, tense, and symbolic prose. His most famous works were *The Ice Palace* and *The Birds*. A prolific au-

thor, he won a number of literary awards, and was considered for the Nobel Prize for Literature on three separate occasions.

Tarjei married the writer Haldis Moren Vesaas and moved back to Vinje in 1934 near the farm where he was born and raised. He lived and wrote for the remainder of his life. The *Telesoga* cover story is written by Trish [Haugo] Wheaton of Toronto, Canada, a second cousin, once removed, of Vesaas.

"The Real Heroes of Telemark" on YouTube

You may have seen the 1965 movie, Heroes of Telemark, starring Kirk Douglas or read Knut Hauklid's book entitled, Skis Against the Atom. These were accounts of the Norwegian sabotage teams that raided the Norsk Hydro's Vermork heavy-water plant near Rjukan in Telemark during 1942 and 1943. Even during World War II when bravery was the norm and heroism was not uncommon on either side, the Norwegian teams and their associated operations in Telemark stand out as quite remarkable and most extraordinary men.



New Telelaget Publications

Telemark to America, Volume II—Settlements (Revised Edition)



In 1992, Telelaget printed 500 copies of *Telemark to America Volume II-Settlements*. Last year we sold our last copy. This volume is rich with settlement history from Wisconsin, Iowa, and Minnesota. This 179-page book has an index including over 5,500 names and places. All the chapters are translations from the early *Telesoga* written by Torkel Oftelie. Torkel visited most of the Telemark settlements in the above mentioned states between the years of 1907 to 1926. The first issue of *Telesoga*, published in 1909, contained the first settlement history. Torkel documented not only names of those living in these settlements, but also the stories of their ancestors - the first settlers in these areas. Volume II has been revised and 200 more copies have been printed. Revisions in the book included adding twenty-four more pictures, making numerous translation and grammatical corrections, explaining location of many place names, and making it more user friendly for younger generations by translating slang terms.

"A year at Haugo farm" by Ingebjørg Draugedal



Telelaget of America has entered into a distribution agreement with Vest-Telemark Museum, the publisher of the English version of the book entitled, "A year at Haugo farm". Under the terms of the agreement, Telelaget will sell and mail copies of the book in the United States and Canada. Author Ingebjørg Draugedal - who now lives in Kviteseid, Telemark, Norway - tells of her life as a girl in 1945, growing up under Nazi occupation on a farm in Telemark that was still as self-sufficient as those our emigrant ancestors left in the 1800's. How did people back then provide for nearly everything they needed themselves? In the book Ingebjørg recounts how they shared the work, the hardships and the pleasures of living on a close-knit family farm. The book describes in detail the practical work that was done on the farm, but it also tells about the relationships between the family members and within the local community, and about the intimate interaction with the surrounding landscape. Ingebjørg's vivid reminiscences breathe life into what is now a bygone

2011 7-Lag Stevne Tours

<u>Hjemkomst Center Tour</u>: Friday, July 15,2011 - \$15 per person


(Leaves Hotel at 8:30 AM; returns at 11:30 AM)

Participants will board a motor coach for the trip to the Center where the Hjemkomst, a replica of a Viking Ship, and the Hopperstad Church, a replica of an ancient stave church, are on exhibit. Built by Robert Asp, the Hjemkomst was sailed from Duluth, MN, to Bergen, Norway, in the summer of 1982. The Hjemkomst made the 6,100 mile trip in 72 days. The ship's crew included three of Robert Asp's sons and a daughter. After completion in 1980, Mr. Asp was able to sail the Hjemkomst on Lake Superior before he passed away later that year. His children helped fulfill that dream. Hjemkomst (pronounced Yem-Komst) is the Norwegian word for homecoming.

The Hopperstad Stave Church is a replica of an ancient church found in Vik, Norway, which was built in the mid-1100s. Local chemist, Guy Paulson, with the help of family and friends, constructed the church over a span of five and a half years. Mr. Paulson, a talented wood carver, completed all the ornate carvings himself. The church was dedicated in 1998 as a gift from the Paulsons to the Center and to Moorhead.

Visitors may also spend time in the Clay County Archives, situated on the lower level, which houses archival resources available for research.



Fergus Falls Tour: Friday, July 15,2010 - \$29 per person

(Leaves Hotel at 12:30 PM; returns at 7:00 PM)

The tour will leave Fargo by motor coach at 12:30 PM and arrive at the Otter Tail County Historical Museum in Fergus Falls by 1:30 PM. The museum is a unique cultural and educational resource in Otter Tail County. Visitors may learn, for example, about the education system in the early years of the local schools. The museum is also home to a genealogy and local history research center where visitors may have access to information helpful in researching family history.



The afternoon will continue with a narrated motor coach tour of Fergus Falls, a city located on the Ottertail River. Dozens of historic buildings and sites in the downtown area tell the story of those who settled here. The castle-like Kirkbride Tower, built in the 1890s, is one of the few remaining complete examples of a Thomas Kirkbride designed psychiatric hospital.

The tour will conclude with a supper at Bethlehem Lutheran Church which had its beginnings as far back as 1872. Bethlehem Church was destroyed by a tornado in June of 1919, an event which devastated the entire area. The church was quickly rebuilt by 1920. After a delicious and typical church supper of meatballs, mashed potatoes and lefse, tour participants will board their motor coach for the trip back to Fargo, arriving in time for the 7-Lag Stevne general meeting.

Bonanzaville: \$7 adults, \$4 children 6-16, 5 and under free.

(Participants are on their own to schedule visits.)

Bonanzaville is located near the Doublewood Inn so attendees may drive to the site of this historical village of more than 40 buildings. Guests will take a step back in time to the Red River Valley of the late 1800s and early 1900s. Tours are self-guided. The buildings have been restored to the style of the period. Look for the one-room schoolhouse which served students well into the twentieth century, the Cass County Courthouse which is arranged as it was in 1904, the Land Office Bank where hopeful land seekers filed the papers necessary for land ownership, the Furnburg Store which provided settlers with supplies and was also the local post office. Experience what it was like for people who lived iduring the area's settlement days.
