Greetings from the President

This has been a very busy and successful year for Telelaget of America. We have released our third in a series of *Telemark to America* books; participated in another 7-*Lag Stevne*; increased our membership at a time when most ethic heritage groups are declining in membership; and recently completed another popular tour of Telemark as well as Stavanger and Oslo.

Having participated in my third tour, I can attest to the quality of the 2012 tour and the high level of satisfaction by the 45 participants. Much of the success can be attributed to the leadership of Elaine Nordlie, whose knowledge of Norway and whose communication skills are second to none.

This year's tour provided an option for participants to hike in the mountains of Setesdal and western Telemark. The area known as the Hardanger plateau features a very rugged terrain, often treeless and snow-covered even during the summer months. Twelve individuals along with eight Norwegians participated in the four-day hike led by hiking guides Tone Jorunn Tveito and Harald Omnes. Hikers stayed in cabins along the way and prepared their meals.

One of the somewhat unique features of Telelaget tours is the emphasis upon visits

to ancestral farms. Elaine assisted in making arrangements for most of the tour participants. One of the joys of the tour is to witness the elation, sometimes very emotional, of individuals as they first visit a farm home of one of their ancestors.

I was pleased to be joined on the tour by my daughter and three granddaughters. They also participated in the hike. It was gratifying to see the interest in their ancestry and impressions of the scenery. As we were watching the fog lift and the sun break through over the Bandak from my grandmother's home churchyard in Lårdal, one exclaimed. "Grandpa, this is the most beautiful sight I have ever seen".

The only downside of the tour for me was my experience driving in Oslo after getting separated from the tour bus. Even with Darrel Johnson's able assistance, it took two hours of traversing tunnels, parallel one-way streets and construction sites to locate our hotel.

Rachel Gorka, who lives in New Richmond, Wisconsin, works at the Minnesota Historical Society in St. Paul, Minnesota as a financial analyst. Her financial management expertise will contribute to the work of the board of directors. Rachel was a member of the planning committee for the 2009 7-Lag Stevne held at the University of Wisconsin – River Falls. She also participated in the 2007 Telelaget tour where she visited ancestral

farms in Notodden and Lårdal. Rachel's maternal greatgrandparents both emigrated from the Telemark region. Her great-grandfather Gregar Anundson emigrated in 1870 and her great-grandmother Johanne Torgerson emigrated in 1872. They both settled in Dunn County, Wisconsin in the rolling hills that were reminiscent of the hills of their Telemark. Rachel enjoys genealogy, knitting and gardening. Rachel and her husband, Cliff, have two children and one granddaughter.

Jim Oftelie is an engineer with Caterpillar Corporation, who currently now lives in Joliet, Illinois. He a mechanical engineer and MBA by training and specializes in hydraulic circuit and component design for off-road vehicles. Norwegian-American Center Project

Norway House, a Minnesota-based Norwegian-American organization whose mission is to be a bridge between contemporary Norway and the United States, is conducting a project that entails the establishment of a Norwegian-American Center in collaboration with Mindekirken Church. The Center is intended to be a resource available to all area Norwegian-American groups. It will serve as an event and cultural center; provide office and meeting rooms; and have a gallery and exhibition area for participating organizations.

First phase funding for the Center, that will be located adjacent to Mindekirken Church on Franklin Avenue in Minneapolis, has been pledged. A purchase agreement for an existing office facility has been signed. 2013 7-Lag Stevne to be Held in St. Cloud



The 2013 7-Lag Stevne is scheduled to be held from Thursday, July 11 to Saturday, July 13 at the Holiday Inn Suites in St. Cloud, Minnesota. Hadeland Lag will serve as the host for the stevne.

Sladky, who also serves as Telelaget's webmaster, will be the *stevne* coordinator. The logo for the 2013 *stevne* includes the battle cry found on the flag given to the 15th Wisconsin (Scandinavian) Regiment by the Society Nora in Chicago as the newly formed unit made its way to the front in March of 1862.

the war's impact on those waiting at home will be discussed by speakers and in classes throughout the *stevne*. At present class topics include: 15th Wisconsin/ Scandinavian Regiment, the Dakota Conflict, the Andersonville Prison, the Civil War in Minnesota, and Norwegian-Americans in the Confederacy. Gene Estensen, former Telelaget Board Member and Historian will be among the presenters. Gene, who has several ancestors who served in 15th Wisconsin Regiment, has done a significant research on the Civil War.

The Stearns County Museum, the Hill Library at St John's University to learn about their medieval illuminated bible project, the Military Museum at Camp Ripley including its artifact-filled Civil War exhibit and boyhood home of famed aviator Charles Lindbergh are among the tours planned during the *stevne*.

A buffet supper and program will be held on Friday evening. There will be a full slate of classes on Saturday. Individual lag meetings will be held on Saturday afternoon. The Saturday evening banquet will include entertainment by members of *Furuleiken spel og danselag* from Gran, Lunner, and Ringerike Norway.



Minutes of 2012 Telelaget Annual Meeting

President John Haugo welcomed members of to the Telelaget Annual meeting held on July 21, 2012 at the Olympia Conference Center in Oconomowoc, Wisconsin. He called the meeting together at 8:00 a.m. All attending members introduced themselves and told where their ancestors were from in Telemark and when they immigrated to the United States. Members of the Board of Directors in attendance were Elaine Nordlie, Joran Olson, Darrel Johnson, John Haugo, Jim Skree, and Shelley Jerviss. Twenty-eight members attended the meeting.

Secretary's Report: Since Secretary Shirley Viesselman was not in attendance last year's annual meeting minutes were distributed electronically.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Shelley Jerviss presented the Treasurer's report. She reported that revenue for the period from July 1, 2011 to June 30, 2012 was \$11,084 with membership dues accounting for \$4,611. Operating expenses for the year were \$14,969. The primary shortfall for the year was that over \$3000 had been paid for printing of unsold Telelaget to America Series: Volume III. Telelaget's bank balances totaled \$24,080 with \$2,637 in the checking account, \$8,606 in Savings Account 1, \$2,217 in Savings Account II, \$10,620 in a CD. There is 11,406.25 NOK in our Norwegian account. Joran Olson moved and Elaine Nordlie seconded the motion to accept the Treasurer's report as presented. The motion passed.

President's Report: President Haugo stated that most of the organizations accomplishments would be highlighted in his report of 2012 goals. He complimented the diligent work and leadership of various individuals. He noted that Telelaget was one of few lag that have shown an increase in membership. John also commented on the popularity of the upcoming Telemark Tour and of the success of our various publications including the Telemark to America series, Telesoga, and TeleNews. He reported that approximately one-half of the membership is now receiving TeleNews mailed to their email address.

Membership Report: Membership Chair Joran Olson reported on the membership statistics for the 2012 year. She noted that we now have 448 family units and 621 individual memberships. We have added 44 new members during the year and lost 39 members. At present we have 33 Norwegian members. We also have eight members who have selected the new option of a lifetime membership.

Genealogist's Report: Genealogist Darrel Johnson reported that the genealogy table was very busy during the stevne. He has purchased a laptop computer for Telelaget for genealogy use. Darrell also reviewed statistics on the "Coming Home" part of our Web site.

Webmaster's Report: In the absence of Webmaster Anne Sladky, President Haugo highlighted her report on Web site activity. Over the past year our Web site, www.telelaget.com, was been accessed 27,762 times with 74,302 pages of Web site material being viewed.

That is an average 77 visits and 206 pages per day.

Telesoga Report: Telesoga Editor, Alice Kirn, who was unable to attend the Stevne, sent a written report. She noted that the May cover story about Dr. Hamlet Peterson caught the attention of Torbjørn Greipsland, a Telemark journalist who asked permission to use information and pictures to prepare an article that appeared in the Rjukan Arbeiderblad on June 23. Alice stated that the feature story for the November 2012 Telesoga will involve our tour with a picture of the hikers on the cover. She also has a number of other articles planned for the November issue that will enable Telesoga to continue to keep the memory of our Telemark ancestry alive through stories, history, reminiscences, and achievements among the descendants.

Board of Directors Nominating Committee: Darrel Johnson, chair of the nominating committee, nominated Rachel Gorka, Bill Hoberg, and Jim Oftelie, to serve on the board of directors for three-year terms. Gorka and Oftelie are new board members and Hoberg will be serving a second three-year term. A motion was made by Elaine Nordlie and seconded by Shelley Jerviss to accept these members as new board members. The motion passed.

A number of individuals commented on the contributions made by Jim Skree who has served on the board for over 20 years. Haugo noted that Jim will be recognized at the next meeting of the board and that he will continue to serve as Historian.

Publications Report – Jim Skree, Publications Chair, and Treasurer Shelley Jerviss reported on the sales of publications over the past year. They reported that during the last year 19 copies of Telemark to America – Volume I, 36 of Volume II, and 62 of Volume III had sold during the last year. They also noted that a significant number of books had sold during the stevne.

2012 Goals: President Haugo discussed the ten annual goals of Telelaget (include if more space needed.) He noted that excellent progress had been made over the past year towards the attainment of these goals.

2012 Telemark Tour: Elaine Nordlie, Tour Leader, gave a report on the latest news about our tour to Norway scheduled for July 30 to August 9. She stated that the tour is full and there are participants. Elaine noted that twelve tour participants have signed up for the four-day hiking option in which they would participate with eight Norwegians. She emphasized that one of the most popular elements of the tour were the visits to ancestral farms. Elaine noted that Harald Omnes and Anne Haugen Wagn, our Telelaget Board directors from Telemark, helped arrange farm visits.

Darrel Johnson moved and Jan Frye seconded a motion to adjourn the meeting . The motion passed.



<u> Telemark to America, Volume I — Emigration</u>




In 1837 the first Telemark emigrants set off for America beginning a stream of thousands starting a new life in a strange land. They retained a love for Telemark that has been passed down through the generations. This volume is a collection of articles written both by authors from Telemark and Americans with roots in Telemark, as well as translation of articles written long ago. It tells as complete but concise a story of Telemark emigration as possible and gives insight into the country that the immigrants left behind.

Telemark to America, Volume II—Settlements




Volume II is rich with settlement history from Wisconsin, Iowa, and Minnesota. All the chapters are translations from the early Telesoga written by Torkel Oftelie. Torkel visited most of the Telemark settlements in the above mentioned states between the years of 1907 to 1926. The first issue of *Telesoga*, published in 1909, contained the first settlement history. Torkel documented not only names of those living in these settlements, but also the stories of their ancestors - the first settlers in these areas.

NEW! Telemark to America, Volume III— Settlements, Biographies, and Telemark Lore



Volume III of the *Telemark to America* series was published and released in July, 2011. The book is divided into three parts: articles on settlement history, emigrant biographies, and Telemark folklore. Much of the content was provided by Torkel Oftelie where he spent over twenty years visiting the settlements and documenting the lives of the Telemark emigrants. Torkel was concerned about the rich Telemark cultural heritage not be left behind. As with the other volumes, it is a valuable resource in searching for your Telemark ancestors, farms, and customs.

"A Year on Haugo Farm" by Ingebjorg Draugedal



This is the English version of the book in which the author - who now lives in Kviteseid, Telemark, Norway - tells of her life as a young girl in 1945, growing up under Nazi occupation on a farm in Telemark that was still as self-sufficient as those our emigrant ancestors left in the 1800's. The book recounts how they shared the work, the hardships and the pleasures of living on a close-knit family farm. It describes in detail the practical work that was done on the farm.
