The 2014 7-Lag Stevne was held from Thursday, July 17 to Saturday, July 19 at the North Dakota State College of Science campus in Wahpeton, ND. The theme was "The Norway of Your Ancestors". Attendance was down from recent years with only 212 attendees including 36 Telelaget members. Telelag, Numedal, Landings, Hadeland, Ringerike-Drammen, Sigdal, and Toten lags participated.

Great Entertainment was provided by Auntie Kreamsaugen [Darlene Rolle], humorist from Detroit Lakes, MN on Friday. On Saturday night after the banquet and bunad parade, Morten Harangen of Kvelde, Norway gave a presentation entitled, "Through Norway with Steamship and Cariole". He compared old photos taken in 1892 throughout Norway with the same scenes as they look today.

There were four well-attended classes presented including one by Telelaget's John Haugo entitled "Writing a Family History". Even with lower than normal attendance, genealogist Darrel Johnson assisted by Carol Johnson and Elaine Nordlie were busy assisting those interested in researching their Telemark ancestry. President's Report - Bill Hoberg Stevne went well overall, despite low turnout. There was no evaluation form circulated this year, as is customary.

The NSI meeting this year will be 11 October; Bill will attend.

Bill presented outgoing president, John Haugo, with a certificate of appreciation.

Membership – Joran Olson Judy Mathison will become new membership chair.

60 members have not renewed this year. Currently at 324 members, 22 complimentary members.

1/3 of members want email and paper versions of newsletters sent.

Master list of members will be sent to board members for reference. List is confidential. Domestic and international laws prohibit sharing, even with TOA membership.

Genealogy – Darrel Johnson "Coming Back Home" (CBH) project is back on track. Letter of appreciation will be sent to Warren Gedstad for contribution to project.

Positive effectiveness of TOA's Facebook page discussed. Joran administrates page.

Webmaster - Ann Sladky CBH material on the TOA website. Online payment for merchandise can be processed through Paypal.

Telenews/TelesogaLila will take over as Telenews editor. Fall mailing will contain both Telenews and Telesoga.

Elaine spoke about issues related to Telesoga with Anne Haugen Wagn, Harald Omnes and Ingjerd Stulen, fellow board officers in Norway. Suggestions given to Alice Kirn are: -Have 1 book/year vs. the 2 we do currently.

-Merge two publications into one.
-Look at how we mail to Norway to be sure we are using lowest-cost method of distribution.

Motion M/S/C to make TeleNews smaller and combine mailing with Telesoga.

Discussed having one larger annual issue of Telesoga rather than the two issues.

Other Business Carol will assist Shelley with materials inventory.

La Crosse, WI is location for 2015 stevne, 2016 will be in Austin, MN. We will host 2017 with Jim, Carol and Lila organizing the event.

May 15 is (centennial) Fellesraad meeting in Brooklyn Center, MN. Elaine and possibly Carol will attend meeting for TOA.

Telemark Tour date will be moved to 2016, since we host stevne in 2017. Discussed employing Norwegian travel bureau, special events for young people, visit to Hardanger-vidda Nasjonalparksenter, and West Telemark Museum.

Lila will design new tri-fold brochure for TOA as current one is outdated.

Motion M/S/C to donate \$500 to Norway House (Fellesraad will match this to \$100).

Bill will perform the financial audit of the books, as he did last year.

Bill proposed formation of the TOA Board Advisory Group, to include John, Shelley, Alice, Darrel and Jim Skree. These people do not serve as directors, yet have important roles in the service of TOA.

Next meeting was tentatively scheduled for 25 April, 2015 at Norway House.
